Including a gift to ARRL in your estate plans is a simple way to build the ARRL Endowment. There are several ways to name ARRL as a beneficiary – the simplest way to make a planned gift to ARRL is to make a bequest in your Will.



Specific Bequest

Designate a specific dollar amount, specific percentage, or specific investment to ARRL.

Residual Bequest

Designate ARRL as the beneficiary of your residual estate. This would provide that, after all debts, taxes, expenses and specific bequests have been paid, the remaining amount, or residual estate, is transferred to ARRL.

Contingent Bequest

If a named beneficiary listed in your Will predeceases you as of the date of your death, that portion of your estate that was specified for that beneficiary passes to ARRL.
